The Newfoundland and Labrador Historic Trust is dedicated to the preservation of the province's historic buildings and landscapes and their importance to communities.

The selection committee reserves the right not to give an award in a category.

If applying for **Heritage Restoration**, please provide at least six digital photographs of the nominated property. At least one photograph should depict the property in its state prior to restoration. Photographs provided should allow the selection committee to determine the exact nature of the restoration carried out. Nominations under this category are considered for finished architectural restoration projects.

If applying for **Tradesperson**, please provide a summary of significant projects completed by the nominee and at least three digital photographs, which are representative of the nominee's work in his or her craft or trade. This award recognizes the skill and contribution of an individual in the craft or trade professions in heritage conservation. The individual must work using specialist and traditional methods and exhibit a high standard of craftsmanship. Individual tradespersons, architects, or other heritage professionals having completed exemplary work relating to the conservation, preservation or restoration of a heritage structure are eligible for nomination.

If applying for **Design in Context**, please provide at least three digital photographs of the nominated property. This award recognizes that building design has the power to encourage economic development and improve the quality of life for residents in an area. Such design may address issues of sustainability and encourage community renewal. The award seeks to recognize individuals or organizations that have completed an architectural design project sensitive to the heritage character of the surrounding environment. New, infill and renovations will be considered for how sympathetic the addition or renovation is to the historic context of the neighbouring area with regard to style, scale, form and building materials.

If applying for **Heritage Stewardship**, please provide at least four digital photographs of the nominated property. Nominations under this category are considered for excellence in long-term maintenance of heritage properties that have not been significantly altered since construction.

If applying for **Adaptive Reuse**, please provide at least three digital photographs of the nominated property. This award recognizes significant projects that adapt heritage buildings to serve new uses in their communities.

Nominations under the **Lifetime Achievement** category are considered in respect of individuals who have dedicated their time to the protection, promotion and preservation of Newfoundland and Labrador's built heritage.
